The bees were pollinating the flowers!



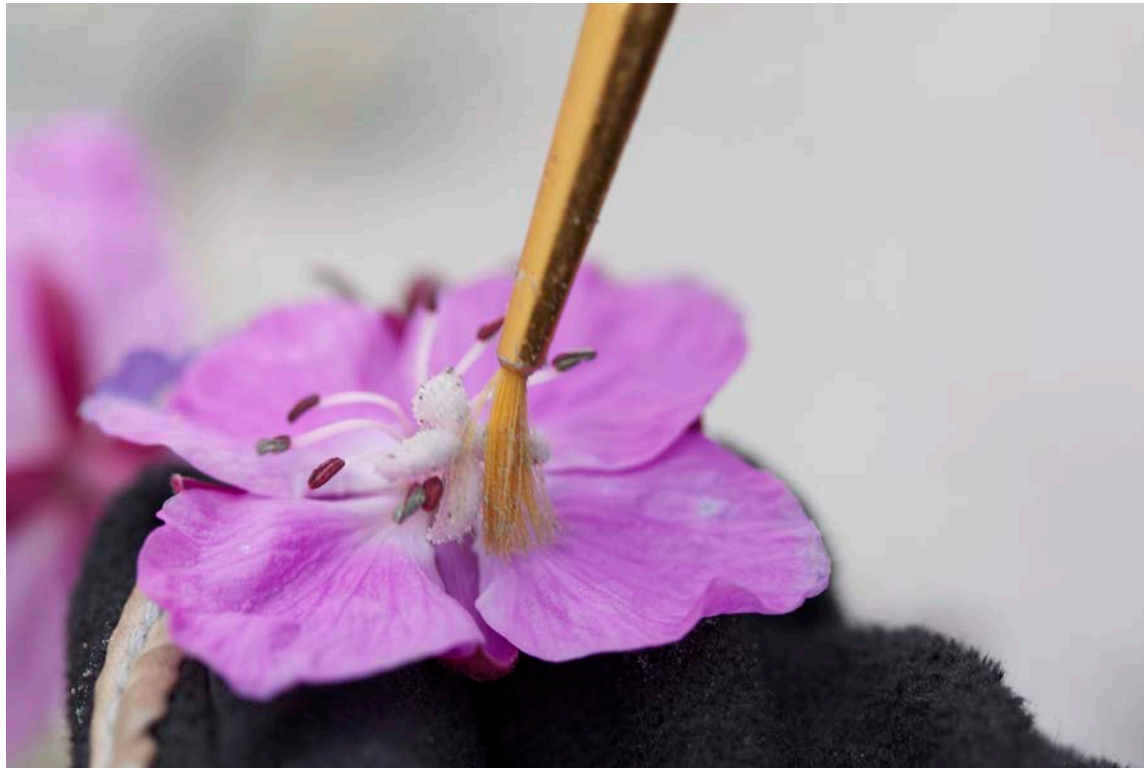
The girl wanted to help the bees.



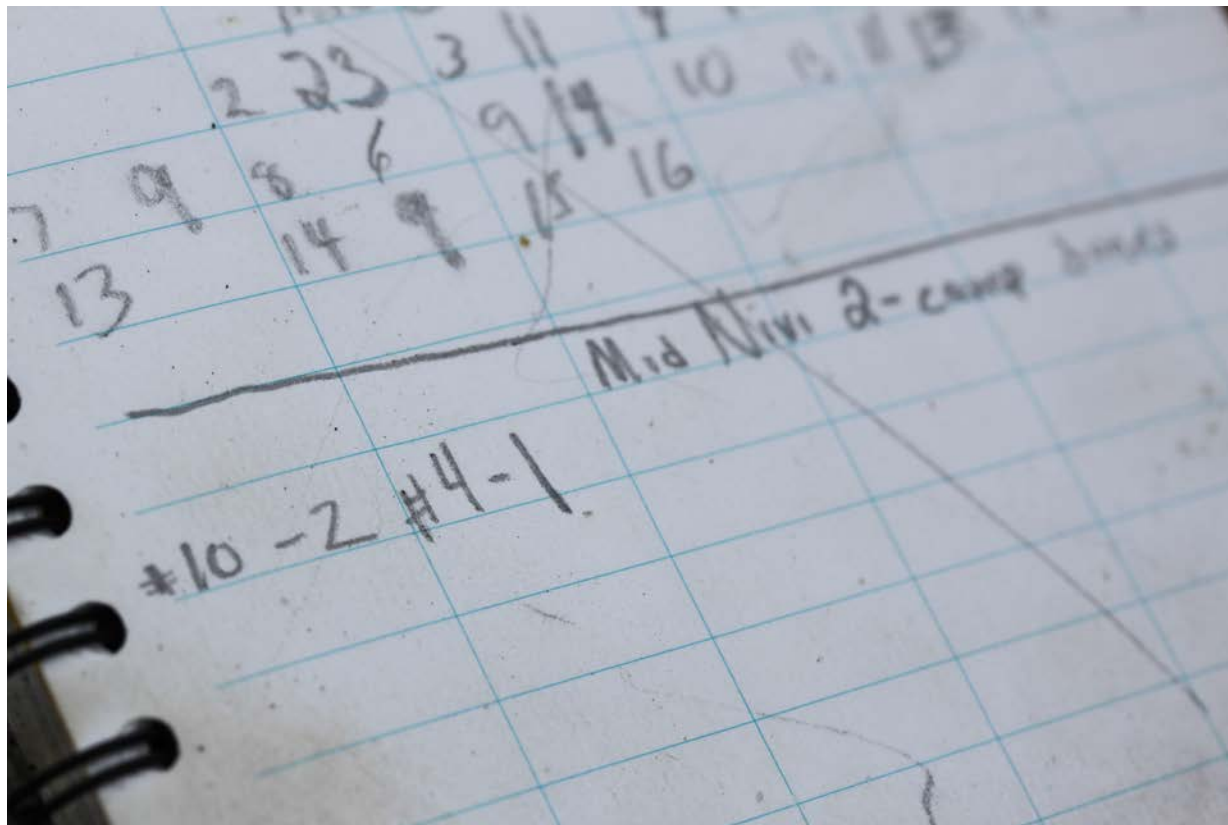
The girl collected pollen.
