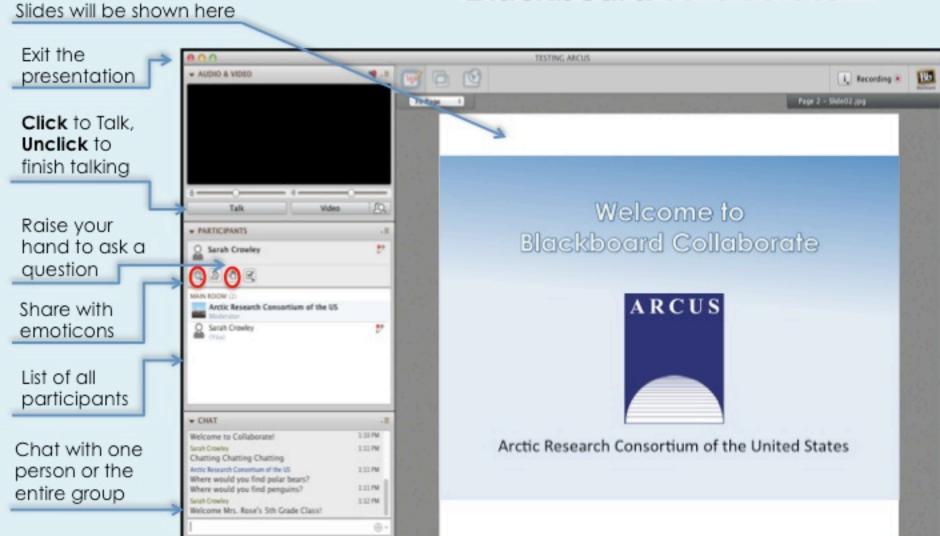





#### **Outreach Highlights**

- Over 80 lesson plans developed as a result of the research experiences and posted online to Learning Resources Database for public use.
- 5 new Collections created as part of Learning Resources including Polar Week.
- 1 new International working group established to look at programs like PolarTREC and how best to assess and measure them.
- 15 Alumni have participated at IPY 2012 Montreal Conference.
  11 Alumni presented either an oral or poster presentation.
- Over 20,000 participants have joined live from the field (Live from IPY & PolarConnect) events (Dec. 2006-present).
